Exhibition 2019 - Update

The very good news is that we have found a venue for our exhibition in 2019. We have provisionally booked Ballard School for the Bank Holiday weekend of 25 to 28 May 2019. The plan is to set up the exhibition on Saturday 25 May and open (10-4) on Sunday and Monday (26 and 27 May) and 10 -2 on Tuesday 28 May to allow time in the afternoon to 'knock down'.

We will use the performing arts centre, with kitchen and seating area, plus two other rooms in the main school building. Both are lovely rooms: one is the chapel, the other, next door, has French doors opening onto the lawn. This should give us plenty of space for quilts, traders, demonstrations and of course a good seating area for tea and cakes. It's a very nice venue and is very competitive for price.

Now we can turn attention to the exciting stuff! We need to decide on a major theme for quilts, plus other displays and challenges.

Since 2019 is believed to be the 40th anniversary of the NFQG, a theme of 'Ruby' has been suggested, perhaps for a challenge for small quilts with judging by visitors.

For a major theme 'New Forest' seems appropriate and gives broad options, forest, coast, towns and villages. A group quilt would be a lovely idea. Other suggestions include a cushion display/tombola, a display of charity work (Linus quilts, syringe driver bags, 'heart cushions for breast cancer patients).

Of course these are just first thoughts so please, if you have any thoughts do let me or any other committee member know.

We will need an Exhibition Committee to look after specific areas of the organisation. These include:

- Budget and financial management Jenny Davies, our Treasurer, has agreed to take this role.
- Organisation of a group quilt if we decide to make one – an artistic director?
- Displays of smaller pieces and challenges – we have discussed the theme of our Ruby Anniversary for example. All things Ruby Red?
- Magazine and local advertising including posters and flyers
- Booking traders Ann Trott has agreed to oversee this area.
- Ideas and booking for demonstrations
- Sales Table what to sell? Will we have themes? (Pat Keane has already offered to take on this role) Proceeds to our charities for the year?
- Refreshments

Many thanks to those who have already offered help. If you feel you could take on one of these organising roles, again please contact me or any committee member. Later on of course we will be asking for help with more specific tasks.

Later in the year we hope to dedicate time at a meeting for more detailed discussions – meanwhile I hope the creative juices will flow and look forward to hearing any ideas.
